



ASYMMETRY IN AMERICA

This year Bridgestone have selected asymmetric rear slick tyres for the United States Grand Prix, having listened to calls from riders following last year's race at Laguna Seca.

The asymmetric rear slicks comprise a harder compound in the left shoulder, for improved durability and stability at high temperature, and a softer compound in the right shoulder, for improved warm-up performance. This softer right shoulder will be particularly beneficial through turns three, four and ten, the circuit's main righthanded corners.



Laguna Seca is the shortest circuit on the calendar with a short main straight of just 0.9km, meaning the tyres spend less time upright and therefore have less time to cool down, resulting in higher tyre temperatures than the ambient and track conditions would suggest.

This year Bridgestone have selected asymmetric rear slicks for Laguna in response to rider calls from last year's US GP

The circuit's elevation changes, particularly through the Corkscrew complex, require a good machine setup, and place a lot of importance on the performance of the front tyre.

Laguna Seca is the shortest circuit on the calendar but this doesn't make it any easier for the tyres. The Corkscrew is a really demanding corner with the fast change of direction and elevation and a strong front tyre is very important to cope with the elevation changes. Performance through the right-handed corners is critical, and this is where we have focussed our improvements this year.

Last year we saw some crashes through turn ten during qualifying and we spoke at length with the riders, listened carefully to what they had to say and deeply analysed the situation, and as a result we have selected asymmetric rear tyres for this year to give the riders more confidence and better grip through the right-handers. The softer right shoulder has a wider temperature operating range and better warm-up, so I am feeling confident about tyre performance.

PEDROSA LOOKING FOR POSITIVE RETURN

Last year's United States Grand Prix winner Dani Pedrosa is confident of taking his good form back to Laguna Seca, the scene of his and the Repsol Honda Team's first victory on Bridgestone tyres. "Laguna is a track that last year I was fast at so I hope I can have another good result this year. We go there in good shape with our recent results" he said, having scored two seconds and a win in the last three races.



LORENZO LOOKING TO EXTEND LEAD

With five wins and three seconds to his name so far in 2010, the championship leader is looking for consistency to consolidate his margin at the top of the standings. "Laguna is a very special track, and very famous" he commented. "Last year I was very fast but I crashed during qualifying, but I made a good race anyway. I will try to make a good race again this year as I haven't won there, but the important thing is to be constant."



STONER LOOKING FOR A LITTLE MORE

After a difficult start to the season,
Casey Stoner has finished on the
podium in the last three races, moving
himself into fourth in the championship.
He concedes he needs a little more
though and is looking to Laguna
hoping for another step: "We're doing
everything we can at the moment,
and everyone's doing the best job they
can. We definitely need those last
few tenths of a second though to be
fighting closer to the front guys."

FACT

His performance in Germany means that Pedrosa, who won at Laguna Seca in 2009, has set four new lap records in the first eight races of this season on his Repsol Honda machine. Pedrosa, Lorenzo, Dovizioso and Barbera are the only riders to have scored points at every race in 2010.



BRIDGESTONE MOTORSPORT ROUND-UP

F1 After the first ten races of the 2010 season, Lewis Hamilton sits at the top of the championship table, 12 points clear of teammate Jenson Button. Mark Webber is third a further five adrift, but himself seven points ahead of teammate Sebastien Vettel. The next race is the German Grand Prix on 25 July at Hockenheim.

GP2 After the British Grand Prix at Silverstone, the fifth round of the season, Pastor Maldonado leads the way in the championship, an impressive 19 points clear of second-placed Dani Clos. Jules Bianchi is third, six points behind Clos. The next races are at the German Grand Prix on 24/25 July at Hockenheim.

IndyCar Will Power scored his fourth victory of the season at the Streets of Toronto Grand Prix on Sunday 18 July, just ahead of Dario Franchitti, who led for 22 laps, and Ryan Hunter-Reay. Power leads the championship from Franchitti ahead of Scott Dixon, Ryan Briscoe and Hunter-Reay. Next up is the Honda Indy Edmonton on 25 July
