SPECIAL CONSTRUCTION FOR AUSTRALIA

The final round of the back-to-back trio that has seen MotoGP in Japan and Malaysia in the last two weeks takes place in Australia at the Phillip Island circuit on 17 October.

The predominantly left-handed circuit features some particularly fast and long corners, namely the final corner which really tests the left shoulder of the rear tyres and generates the highest rear tyre temperatures of the season despite the low ambient temperature. The rear Bridgestone slicks selected are a special construction to ensure their heat resistance and durability.



Asymmetric rear tyres are vital at Phillip Island to balance the intense heat in the left shoulders with the relatively low demands placed on the right shoulders as there are few right-hand corners. Coupled with the low ambient temperature, warm-up performance on the right side is crucial.

The last corner generates the highest rear tyre temperature of the season and requires a special tyre construction

The asymmetric rear slicks combine extra soft compound rubber in the right shoulder to aid warm-up performance, particularly in the cold morning sessions on Saturday and Sunday alongside hard or extra hard compound rubber in the left for heat durability.

TYRE TALK

Phillip Island has a low ambient temperature but is a high speed circuit with an asymmetric anticlockwise layout that has more lefts than rights. Whilst the ambient temperature is cool, the long and fast last corner generates the highest rear tyre temperature of the season in the left shoulders so this requires a special construction to cope with the heat.


By contrast, there are few right hand corners so the right shoulder of the tyres requires good warm-up performance. Coupled with the cool ambient conditions, we are using our extra soft compound rubber in the right shoulder of the softer option rear to improve warm-up feeling for the riders as we expect cold conditions, particularly in the morning.

WORDS FROM A CHAMPION

His third position in Malaysia was his thirteenth podium finish of the season, seven of which have been wins, meaning that he has only finished off the podium twice, both times of which he was fourth. After a remarkably consistent season, Spaniard Jorge Lorenzo lifted the 2010 World Championship title and his first premier class crown at Sepang, realising a boyhood dream. Bridgestone spoke with him after his victory.

"I've always imagined this moment and dreamed about it, but when it comes you don't know what to say! I'm a very lucky guy; I've not had much bad luck this year and I've always been around good teams, on good bikes, and surrounded by people who wanted the best for me, so for this I feel very grateful.

"This pre-season started with some very tough moments, with my injury to my right finger. At that moment I thought that this would be a tough year, perhaps worse than last year, but we were able to make a strong recovery and were strong mentally. In Qatar we finished second and this was the result that gave me the confidence to keep riding fast and keep pushing.

"Then came Jerez, which was the most special race of my life and the first time I won there, which was even better in the circumstances! It was a very important race. Now looking back, I have seven wins and only two races without a podium finish, so what more can I ask?

"Now the championship can disappear, we have it on our hands, in our pocket.

Now it's impossible to lose I can relax a bit and really try and enjoy the last three races.

Phillip Island may be difficult because it's not my favourite track, but I want to win.

"I need some time to be quiet to realise

what it means, but this is the happiest moment of my life; it's a dream come true and there are many many people to thank!"

The asymmetric rear tyres Bridgestone have selected for Phillip Island are a special construction to cope with the increased tyre temperature the circuit generates, and the softer option rear also uses the extra soft compound rubber in the right shoulder, especially to improve warm-up performance in the cooler morning sessions



BRIDGESTONE MOTORSPORT ROUND-UP

F1 Red Bull's Sebastian Vettel won the Japanese Grand Prix at Suzuka, finishing less than one second ahead of teammate Mark Webber with Ferrari's Fernando Alonso in third. Webber leads the championship with three races to go, 14 points ahead of Alonso and Vettel who are tied. The top five are still separated by just 31 points.

GP2 Pastor Maldonado has already taken the GP2 Series crown in 2010, which he secured at the Italian Grand Prix. The final round of the series is in Abu Dhabi on 13-14 November.

IndyCar Scott Dixon won the final race of the season, the Cafes do Brasil Indy 300, ahead of Danica Patrick and Tony Kanaan, but it was Dario Franchitti's moment as he clinched the 2010 World Championship, sealing his third IndyCar title.
