





The final act

For the traditional season finale the teams head to Valencia and the Ricardo Tormo circuit during the first weekend of November, two weeks later than last year. Valencia is the third shortest circuit of the season, after Laguna Seca and Sachsenring, and is one of the few with an anti-clockwise format.



The front tyres will have a much easier time in Valencia than they did in Malaysia as, although twistier, the circuit is slower. Consequently the front slicks are available in softer specifications; the soft and medium compounds. The rear

slicks are actually available in the same medium and hard compounds as were used in Malaysia, but with the difference that in Valencia they are asymmetric to compensate for the imbalance of left- and right-handers. Valencia is the sixth race of the season to which Bridgestone have brought asymmetric rear tyres.

Asymmetric rear tyres are needed for good durability on the left side of the tyres and optimal warm-up performance on the right

In the past the temperature has fluctuated significantly year-on-year, so the conditions will play an important role in tyre compound choices, especially as the date this time is later in the year. The total race distance is also one of the longest of the year; thirty laps and just over 120km of racing, or a total of 420 corners for the tyres to contend with.



Valencia is a technically complex circuit with nine left-handers and five rights within a slow, twisty lap that demands good stability and shoulder grip. Although the temperature will be much lower than in Malaysia and the track is slower, is still represents a good technical challenge for us. It's what we could call a busy circuit because the length of the lap and the number of corners means that the tyres are always working and have very little respite. Its anti-clockwise layout means that we need good durability on the left side of the tyres and optimal warm-up performance on the right, making asymmetric rear tyres

Turn 2: If you don't make a pass going into this firstgear corner you have to play follow-my-leader for most of the rest of the lap.

Turn 13: The left side of the rear tyre gets a hard time at Valencia, particularly in this fourth-gear sweep over a blind crest.



New kid on the block

Aleix Espargaro has made quite an impression in the MotoGP paddock in the three races he has competed in this season.

The 20 year-old Spaniard got the surprise call from the Pramac Racing team before Indianapolis when Casey Stoner's absence meant that Mika Kallio spent three races with the factory Ducati Team.

"Yes sure it was a surprise!" said the elder of the Espargaro racing brothers. "This winter I was in my house without a bike to race and to be in MotoGP next season is like a dream."

He was 13th at Indianapolis and 11th at Misano, where he impressively set the fifth fastest lap in the race and was the fastest Ducati rider, aboard his Bridgestone-shod Desmosedici. Replacing an injured Niccolo Canepa in Malaysia, Espargaro replicated his highest MotoGP finish with another 11th.

"In the three races the results were good, but not very, very good." With a new bike and his first experience of Bridgestone's MotoGP tyres, he "had to understand a lot of things. But I improved a lot. I looked at the technical data for Stoner. I saw a lot of things about his style for the



Ducati and I tried to copy them!"

Aleix will replace Canepa with a permanent ride for the Pramac Racing squad next season, having done enough in just his first two races to secure his ascension into MotoGP.

"I have constantly trained and I am sure to be in good physical condition. These last two months are very good for us. For me, three races in MotoGP and a contract for next year, everything is perfect!"

Spies to race in Valencia

Ahead of his seat alongside Colin Edwards with the Monster Yamaha Tech3 team next season, recently crowned Superbike World Champion Ben Spies will compete in the final MotoGP race of the season in Valencia. He will also join the post-event test with Herve Poncharal's team. "We will have learning curves to overcome next year but I am up for my new goal which is to try and stay in the top 6-8."



Kallio rookie of the year

Mika Kallio's tenth-placed finish at the Malaysian Grand Prix secured the Finn the Rookie of the Year title in his first season on Bridgestone tyres. This comes one month after Kallio signed to stay with Pramac Racing next season. Previous winners of the award include Jorge Lorenzo in 2008, Dani Pedrosa in 2006, Toni Elias in 2005, Nicky Hayden in 2003, Daijiro Kato in 2002 and Valentino Rossi in 2000.



Off-season testing gearing up

Following the final round of the 2009 MotoGP season, there will be a test at the Valencia circuit in which all next year's GP riders will participate, including the new riders graduating to the premier class. Although spanning three days, the total test time is two days. Each rider will get two sets of each tyre specification for the first day and then an additional three sets for the second and third days.

Bridgestone Motorsport Round-Up

F1 The final race on the calendar was the Abu Dhabi Grand Prix in Yas Marina. Red Bull Racing's Sebastian Vettel won from teammate Mark Webber and 2009 World Champion Jenson Button for the Brawn GP team. It was a clean sweep for Brawn GP as they claimed the Constructors' title this year too.

GP2 The GP2 Asia Series got underway last weekend in Abu Dhabi. First race honours went to Davide Valsecchi and the iSport Team and DAMS' Christian Vietoris claimed victory in race two. The next race is back in Abu Dhabi on 7 February 2010.

INDYCAR Dario Franchitti won his second IndyCar Series Championship the hard way, winning the final race at Homestead-Miami Speedway to pass Scott Dixon for the title. The Target Chip Ganassi driver finished on 616 points with teammate Dixon just behind on 605 and Penske's Ryan Briscoe a very close third on 604.
