





MUGELLO DEMANDS MORE

Round four of the championship sees the MotoGP paddock travel to Italy and to the fast and flowing Mugello circuit. One of the fastest circuits on the calendar, it is a tough challenge for riders, machines and Bridgestone's tyres.

There are many traits of Mugello that make it so demanding on tyres: The circuit is grippy and abrasive which means that relatively harder tyre compounds are required; it has many long and high speed corners which require good stability and edge grip from the rear tyres; and the heavy braking areas, particularly those downhill,



require good stability and strength from the front tyre.

Along with Catalunya, Motegi and Sepang, Mugello is the toughest circuit all season for the centre section of the rear tyres

The biggest stress on the tyres though is actually placed on the centre section of the rear tyre, largely because of the speed of the circuit and its abrasive tarmac. Casey Stoner's lap record, set on Bridgestone tyres in 2008, was at an average speed of 171.6km/h, the second highest of the season behind only Phillip Island. Along with Catalunya, Motegi and Sepang it is the hardest circuit for the centre section of the rear tyres.

Mugello is one of the fastest circuits on the calendar and is tough on tyres because of the combination of this speed, the track temperature which is often high, and the technically demanding nature. There are significant elevation changes which cause greater loads on the tyres, especially under braking from speeds of over 320km/h. The Arrabbiata, Scarperia and Bucine corners are crucial to good lap times here, so the last half of the lap is very important.

BRIDGESTONE NEWS

SET FOR SILVERSTONE

One of two new circuits on the 2010 MotoGP calendar, Bridgestone engineers have been working hard to select the most suitable tyre compounds for the British round at Silverstone. After carefully analysing and assessing the circuit's layout and character and the nature of the tarmac, and using Formula One data and experience, Bridgestone has selected the medium and hard compound front slicks and the medium and hard asymmetric rear slicks for the grand prix on June 20th.



SLICK DEBUT IN FRANCE

Bridgestone's all-new medium compound asymmetric rear slicks debuted in Le Mans where they were by far the favoured choice in the race given the high track temperature. The same specification slicks will be used at a further three races before the summer break: at Silverstone, Assen and Laguna Seca. These are all races at which asymmetric tyres were not used last year, but have been selected this year in response to requests from riders.



BRIDGESTONE MEANS QUALITY

Bridgestone has won the prestigious PACCAR 50PPM Quality Achievement Award for its performance as a tyre supplier in Europe in 2009. Achieving an exceptional quality control rate in tyre production of fewer than 50 defects per million tyres produced, this is the first time that Bridgestone has received the award which is provided only to a select group of suppliers who can meet such world-class levels of quality and performance.

FACT

In 2009, the first five races of the season were hit by rain, although the MotoGP sessions at Jerez were all run in the dry. This year, the only time the riders have used Bridgestone's wet tyres was during the first Malaysia test at Sepang on 4-5 February.



BRIDGESTONE MOTORSPORT ROUND-UP

F1 After six rounds of the Formula One World Championship, the Red Bull Racing driver pairing of Mark Webber and Sebastian Vettel share the title lead. Ferrari's Fernando Alonso is just three points adrift, with Jenson Button a further five back. After this stat sheet went to print, the Turkish Grand Prix was held on 30 May.

GP2 After two rounds of the ten-race championship, in Spain and Monaco, Sergio Perez leads the standings, two points ahead of joint-second placed Pastor Maldonado and Dani Clos. After this stat sheet went to print, the Turkish Grand Prix was held on 30 May as the third round of the series.

IndyCar This stat sheet went to print just before arguably the most famous race in the world, the Indianapolis 500, held on Sunday 30 May. Prior to this, Will Power led the championship standings, 26 points clear of Scott Dixon with Helio Castroneves a further 28 points behind.
